Class 1	NUPAFEEED / EQUIFEST RIDDEN COBS Open Ridden Cob, mare or gelding 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms. Rider any age. If there are sufficient entries forward, this class may be split as follows: a) Lightweight Ridden Cob b) Heavyweight Ridden Cob. This is a qualifier for Equifest 2018.
Class 2	HAYGAIN / EQUIFEST MAXI COBS Open Maxi Cobs, mare or gelding 4 years old and over, exceeding 155cms – to be judged as Cobs. Rider any age. This is a qualifier for Equifest 2018.
Class 3	RIDDEN COLOUREDS - HORSE/PONY – <i>Kindly Sponsored by Barker Gotelee</i> Open to Skewbald/Piebald/Spots/Duns/Palominos. Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Any type, height or colour combination.
Class 4	RIDDEN FOREIGN & RARE NATIVE BREEDS Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Open to any foreign or rare native breed.
Class 5	RETRAINED RACEHORSE Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, any height. Rider must be 15 years old or over.
Class 6	NOVICE HUNTER Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cms (14.2hh). Not to have been placed first at county level competitions.
Class 7	BLACK COUNTRY SADDLES / EQUIFEST RIDDEN HUNTERS Open Ridden Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 153cms. Rider any age. If there are sufficient entries forward, this class may be split as follows: a) Lightweight Hunter - capable of carrying up to 12.7 stone. b) Middleweight Hunter - capable of carrying 12.7 stone but not 14 stone. c) Heavyweight Hunter - capable of carrying over 14 stone. This is a qualifier for Equifest 2018.
Class 8	NUPAFEEED / EQUIFEST RIDING HORSES Open Riding Horse, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, any height. Rider any age. If there are sufficient entries forward, this class may be split as follows: a) Small Riding Horses - exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 158cms. b) Large Riding Horses - exceeding 158cms. This is a qualifier for Equifest 2018.

Class 26	TACK AND TURNOUT – Ridden Horses or Ponies Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, any height.
Class 27	LEADING REIN PONY Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 128cms, suitable for and ridden by a child not to have attained their 9th birthday before 1 January in the current year. (Ponies must be shown in snaffle bridles. The attendant must affix the lead rein to the noseband only). All entrants will receive a rosette.
Class 28	BEST RIDING/PONY CLUB TYPE HORSE or PONY Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Will be required to jump 3 fences, height not to exceed 85cms. Open to all.
Class 29	FIRST RIDDEN PONY Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 128cms, suitable for and ridden by a child not to have attained their 12 th birthday before 1 January in the current year. All pony club members/branches and non-members welcome. Snaffle bridles only. Competitors will be required to walk and trot together and canter individually only.
Class 30	FAMILY HORSE or PONY Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. For horses and ponies suitable to be ridden by all members of the family.
Class 31	VETERAN IN HAND HORSE/PONY Stallion, mare or gelding, 15 years old or over. Open to horses and ponies of any breed and height. If there are sufficient entries forward this class will be split.
Class 32	VETERAN RIDDEN HORSE/PONY Stallion, mare or gelding, 15 years old or over. Open to horses and ponies of any breed and height. If there are sufficient entries forward this class will be split.
Class 33	NOVICE HORSE OR PONY Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, any height. Combination not to have won a first placed rosette. Walk and trot together, canter individually only. If sufficient entries the class will be split horses and ponies.
Class 34	RIDDEN RESCUE Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Open to all rescued horses or ponies.

BUCKLESHAM RING

Run under SSA Rules defined in the current Member's Handbook. Open to SSA Members and Non-Members. Competitors must wear a hat to current Safety Standard or above.

Class 35	EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIPS OPEN QUALIFYING CLASS Members carrying their current Championship Points Cards are eligible for SSA rosettes to 3rd Adult and 3rd Junior places and SSA Championship Points. Southernden Farm offers a rosette to the highest placed Member aged under 14 on 1st January of the current year. Side Saddle International offer a rosette to the Adult Member and Manor Grange Stud Show Centre to the Junior Member, judged to be the best turned out.

Class 36	CLASSICAL LADIES SIDE SADDLE QUALIFIER Open to SSA Adult Members and Non-members, aged 18 and over on January 1st of the current year, riding side saddle, on horses exceeding 148cm (14.2hh). To be judged 25% conformation and action, 25% manners & way of going, 25% rider, and 25% turnout of horse & rider, by a SHBGB, BSHA, BSPS, P(UK) or SSA Panel Judge. Judges may request a short show, but will not ride exhibits; horses will not be stripped. Traditional habits must be worn. Fancy Dress and Period Costumes NOT permitted. Judges are requested to use the mark sheet provided. The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. In the event of previous qualification, this may be passed down to fourth place. Special rosettes are offered by Mrs T Mitchell to the winner and if the winner has already qualified, a second rosette is awarded with the Qualification Card. Qualifying combinations are required to become Full Members of the SSA 21 days prior to the National Side Saddle Show or as soon as possible if qualified after that date to be eligible to be eligible to compete at the Final. Combinations qualifying between one National Side Saddle Show and the next may carry forward the qualification, for that year only. The highest placed Riding Horse, Hack (not exceeding 160cm), Cob or Hunter, Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, ridden by a SSA Adult Member qualifies for the current year's BSHA Championship Show DMSL Phone Systems Ladies Show Horse Championship and if already qualified the ticket will go to the next highest placed horse down to 5th place. Combinations qualifying after the current year's BSHA Championship Show may carry forward the qualification, to the following year. SSA Members who qualify for The Ladies Show Horse Championship, will not be required to join the BSHA in order to compete in any Side Saddle class at the BSHA National Championship Show. If the BSHA Championship Show entries have closed at the time of qualification, competitors will not be charged a late entry fee for the Championship.

Class 37	BEST HORSE OR PONY RIDDEN SIDE SADDLE Open to horses and ponies 4 years old or over: conformation & manners will be taken into consideration; horses/ponies will not be stripped. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards. Competitors must wear a hat to current Safety Standard or above. ** The Highest placed coloured exhibit (who has not already qualified) receives a Special Rosette and qualifies for the Side Saddle Final at the CHAPS Championship Show. Open to any type of exhibit. Riders must be 16 or over. Riders/Owners need not be a member or their exhibit registered with CHAPS at the time of qualification, but in order to compete at the Championships, the Rider/Owner must be a showing member and their horse/pony registered with CHAPS before entering the final.

Class 38	SIDE SADDLE CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse and rider. Attention may be paid to the rider's personal appearance but detailed inspection of rider or tack is not required. Fancy dress or period costume is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the Judge may ask groups of 3 or 4 riders to give short displays. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult Member and Junior Member of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards

Class 39	<u>SPILLERS / EQUIFEST MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND IN HAND</u> Open to In Hand Mountain & Moorland ponies registered with their respective Pure Bred Societies of Connemara, Dales, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Shetland, Welsh A, B, C and D. Stallion, mare, colt, filly or gelding, any age. This class may be divided as appropriate. This is a qualifier for Equifest 2018.
Class 40	<u>EQUIFEST OPEN RIDDEN MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND</u> Open to Mountain & Moorland ponies registered with their respective Pure Bred Societies of Connemara, Dales, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Shetland, Welsh A, B, C and D. Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Rider any age. This class may be divided as appropriate. This is a qualifier for Equifest 2018.
Class 41	<u>MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND TYPE AND PART-BRED RIDDEN</u> Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Open to all M & M types. Non-registered only. Class will be split in to large and small breeds if sufficient entries.
Class 42	<u>CAVERNOMA ALLIANCE UK / EQUIFEST MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND LEAD REIN</u> Open to Mountain & Moorland ponies, registered with their respective Pure Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, New Forest, Shetland and Welsh A or B. Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 9 th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be led by an attendant and shown in a Snaffle Bridle, the lead rein to be attached to the noseband only. This is a qualifier for Equifest 2018.
Class 43	<u>EQUI-CHIP / EQUIFEST MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND FIRST RIDDEN</u> Open to Mountain & Moorland ponies, registered with their respective Pure Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, New Forest, Shetland, and Welsh A or B. Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 12 th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be shown in any suitable bridle. This is a qualifier for Equifest 2018.

Class 44	IN-HAND YOUNGSTOCK Colt, filly or gelding, yearling, 2 or 3 years old. Open to all, any height.
Class 45	IN-HAND HUNTER/RIDING HORSE TYPE Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Open to all, any height.
Class 46	IN-HAND FOREIGN OR RARE NATIVE BREED Colt, filly, stallion, mare or gelding, any age. Open to all, any height.
Class 47	IN-HAND MINIATURE PONY Colt, filly, stallion, mare or gelding, over one year old.
Class 48	IN-HAND NOVICE HORSE OR PONY Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Horse not to have been placed 1 st -3 rd in any competition.
Class 49	IN-HAND NOVICE HANDLER Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Handler not to have been placed 1 st -3 rd in any competition.
Class 50	<u>BSPA / EQUIFEST IN HAND PIEBALD / SKEWBALD</u> Open in Hand Piebald / Skewbald stallion, mare, colt, filly or gelding, any age. The first three places will also qualify for the BSPA Championships. Subject to their show rules & conditions. If there are sufficient entries forward this class may be split.
Class 51	RIDDEN THELWELL – Fun Class Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Open to all.
Class 52	BEST HORSE OR PONY THE JUDGE WOULD MOST LIKE TO TAKE HOME - Fun Class Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Open to all, any height.
Class 53	PRETTIEST HORSE OR PONY - Fun Class Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Open to all, any height

SUFFOLK AGRICULTURAL ASSOCIATION AUTUMN SHOW

BY-LAWS

1) Judging

The Judges to commence their judging at the appointed time as detailed in the schedule. The Judge's decision is final. The Association reserves the right to substitute other Judges for those mentioned in the schedule without notification to exhibitors and others.

2) Exhibitors

All exhibitors must be prepared to have their horses in the Showground ready to be judged at the appointed time. Those in charge of animals shall be subject to the orders of the Show Manager and Stewards of the show. No animal will be admitted to the showground without a proper halter. The organisers reserve the right to stop or prevent a horse or pony competing for whatever reason, at their discretion.

3) Health & Safety

The Show environment can be upsetting for horses, even those of a normally placid temperament. Horses with unstable or aggressive temperaments must not be brought to the Showground.

4) Protest

In all cases of disputed awards, the protest, in writing, shall be made to the Secretary within an hour of delivering such award. The person protesting shall at the same time of making the protest deposit with the Secretary the sum of £25.00. The same shall be returned to the party protesting if the protest is sustained and in the case of it not being sustained the deposit shall be forfeited to the funds of the Association. The Secretary, if possible, shall give notice of the protest to the person against whom it is made. The Secretary and Show Manager shall, if possible, decide the case that day, otherwise it shall be referred to the Committee whose decision shall be binding and conclusive on all parties and no action at law shall be brought or maintained in respect thereof. No member of the Committee or Steward shall take part in the settlement of the disputed Award for which he is a competitor.

5) Hard Hats

It is mandatory for **All** riders (including judges) to wear a protective helmet manufactured to conform to current approved BSI or European Standard. Such headgear must be worn with a chinstrap correctly and securely fastened at all times whilst mounted on the showground. The Association accepts no responsibility or liability for any injury arising from failure to comply with this regulation.

6) Car Parks

Motor cars, lorries, coaches, motor cycles and cycles admitted will be left along with contents entirely at owner's risk.

7) Entry Fees

The SAA reserves the right not to accept an entry. Entry fees cannot be refunded unless a veterinary certificate is produced in respect of the horse or a doctor's certificate in respect of the exhibitor or rider. There will be a compulsory first aid charge of £2.00 per exhibitor.

8) Lost Children

Children who become separated from their parents or carers should be taken to the secretary's office and a member of staff informed.

9) Dogs

Dogs are allowed on the Showground but must be kept on leads at all times. Please clean up after your dog.

10) Veterinary assistance

A Veterinary officer will be on call. Exhibitors are liable for any costs incurred from treatment by the veterinary officers.

11) The organisers reserve the right to split/amalgamate classes at their discretion.

12) The organisers reserve the right to amend, cancel or change any class in the schedule.

13) The horse walk must be used to access the Grand and Trinity Rings. Exercise kept to the collecting rings only, no horses/ponies permitted in the public areas.

14) Lunging is strictly prohibited on the showground.

15) No litter to be left anywhere and mucking out of horseboxes and trailers on the showground is strictly prohibited.

16) **Stallions**

No exhibitor shall allow a stallion for which he/she is responsible as owner, lessee, authorised agent or rider to compete or be prepared to compete in any class without taking adequate precautions to ensure that other competitors and members of the public are not put at risk of injury.

17) **Disclaimer of Liability**

17.1) Subject to clause 17.2, the Suffolk Agricultural Association, its Trustee Board, its officers, employees, agents or subcontractors (together the "**Association**") will not be liable for or accountable to any person for:

(a) any accident or injury, fatal or otherwise, or for any disease, damage or loss that may occur to any person;

(b) any theft, damage, destruction or loss of property;

(b) loss or damage that may occur to or be caused by any animal, article or vehicle exhibited or brought on to the Showground or car parks.

17.2) Nothing in this disclaimer shall limit or exclude the Association's liability for:

(a) death or personal injury or damage to property caused by negligence on the part of the Association; or

(b) any matter in respect of which it would be unlawful for the Association to exclude or restrict liability.

17.3) Each exhibitor, competitor, its employees, agents or subcontractors (together the "**Exhibitor**") shall be held solely liable for any accident, loss, injury or damage that may occur to or be caused by any animal, article, vehicle or property exhibited or brought on to the Showground or car parks by the Exhibitor.

17.4) The Exhibitor shall indemnify and keep the Association indemnified against all liabilities, losses, costs, expenses and damages, including a claim made against the Association by a third party for death, personal injury or damage to property (including but not limited to any direct, indirect or consequential losses, loss of profit, loss of reputation and all interest, penalties and legal and other professional costs and expenses) suffered or incurred by the Association as a result of or in connection with any animal, article, vehicle or property brought on to the Showground or car parks by the Exhibitor.

17.5) Acceptance of the provisions of this disclaimer shall be a condition of entry.

17.6) The Exhibitor will have in force, maintain and comply with the terms of its own appropriate insurance (with a minimum limit of £5 million per claim for Public, Products and Pollution Liability) to cover all risks and liabilities which the Exhibitor may incur.

17.7) The Association reserves to itself by its Trustee Board or with the authority of that body the Chairman of the Executive the sole and absolute right to interpret these or any other prescribed conditions and regulations and arbitrarily to settle and determine all matters questions or differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incidental to the Show. Also to refuse and to cancel any entries and relax any conditions or regulations as the Association may deem expedient.

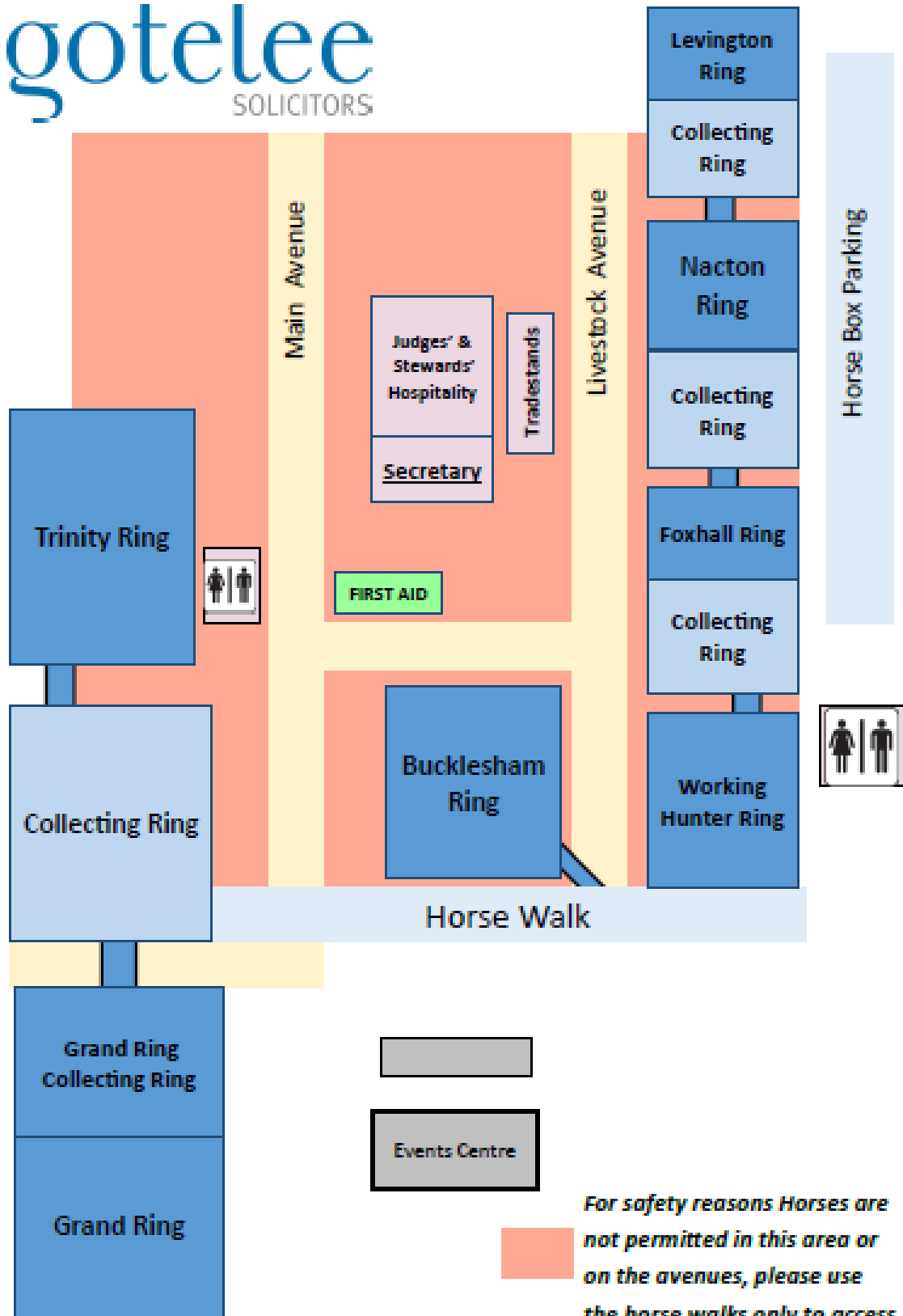
17.8) The Association reserves to its Trustee Board the sole right of decision to postpone, cancel, abandon or curtail the Show. Where such decision arises from events outside of the control of the Association, the Association shall not accept liability for any indirect or consequential loss, loss of profit, loss of reputation, all interests and penalties financial or otherwise arising thereby, nor for the refund of any fees and charges paid.

17.9) Subject to clause 1.2, the Association's maximum aggregate liability (for breach of contract or arising in tort or on any other basis whatsoever) shall be limited to the entry fee paid by the Exhibitor.
