

What are the opening times?

The gates open at 7am and last entry is 5.30pm. All tradestands are open from 8.30am until 6pm on both days. There will be a live band playing at 6.30pm on Wednesday next to the Ringside Clubs.

How much are tickets?

Early bird ticket prices are available up to midnight on Friday, May 18 - adult admission £23, senior citizen £20, young person £7, car park £5 and under 15s go free. From Saturday, May 19 to Tuesday, May 29, adult admission is £25, senior citizens are £22, a young persons' ticket is £9, and car parking is £5. Under 15s still go free.

After this date tickets will still be available online and at the gates, but at the full price. Tickets are valid for either day. If you attend the show both days, consider becoming a member of the SAA as membership benefits include tickets to both days of the show and forward car parking. You are also able to purchase discounted members' guest passes. Buy tickets either online, by phone (call 01473 707110), at local retailers and post offices, or at the gates on show days.

How can I get to the show?

- **Car** - The Suffolk Show is held at Trinity Park, Felixstowe Road, Ipswich, Suffolk, IP3 8UH.
- **Bus** - A number of bus services will be available from Ipswich central and Ipswich railway station.
- **Bike** - We will be providing a dedicated cycle parking area at the main Felixstowe Road entrance.
- **Train** - Ipswich railway station is just five miles away from Trinity Park.
- **Taxi** - There is a taxi drop off point on Murrills Road, off the roundabout at gate one. Visitors can then enter the showground through the pedestrian entrance.
- **Coach** - Coaches enter through Gate One and there is a designated coach park. The coach driver is admitted free. When travelling to the show, please follow the AA signs.

Can I bring my dog?

Well-behaved dogs on leads are welcome, however, they are not permitted in the ringside clubs or food hall. Please do not under any circumstances leave dogs in cars.

There will also be a number of doggy watering points around the showground, which are kindly sponsored by Skinner's Pet Foods.

What is the policy for lost children?

Children's wristbands will be given out at the gates for parents and guardians to write an emergency contact number on, so if the child gets lost they can be contacted.

Lost children should be taken to stand white 515, where members of St John



Ambulance will be providing this service.

What provision is there for disabled visitors?

There is a hospitality centre for disabled people at the show offering advice and help to disabled visitors – this is near the Bucklesham entrance at stand 363. All toilet blocks have accessible toilets for disabled visitors.

Disabled visitors are charged the appropriate full price admission, but an accompanying carer is admitted at no cost and does not require a ticket. Event Mobility Charitable Trust will be providing electric scooters and manual wheelchairs for the use of disabled, elderly and mobility impaired visitors to the show. To reserve an electric scooter or manual wheelchair please contact Event Mobility direct.

Are baby changing and feeding facilities available?

Baby feeding and changing facilities are available at the under 5s change and play area at stand white 515.

Can I get cash out at the show?

Mobile cash machines will be situated on the showground. Please note that a charge is made on each withdrawal.

Where can I buy food and drink?

There are plenty of places to buy food and drink at the show including Adnams Beach Eats, Greene King Eat Street and Adnams Food & Drink Experience.

Where can I find more information on the day?

Show information stands are located at each entrance. The stands will be issuing free show guides, selling catalogues and distributing children's wristbands.

Is there a courtesy buggy service?

To help disabled visitors and those who have difficulty walking around the show, there will be a special buggy service. The buggies, kindly sponsored by Ashtons Legal, will operate on a continual loop with drop off points at the three entrances and main points around the show.
